From the Vicarage

Dear Friends,

Easter's coming A time for Peace!

Always the way isn't it... no sooner have we started the New Year, than the Rector starts talking about Lent and Easter!



Well, to be fair, I do it as much for myself as for anyone

else. I'm not a great fan of January or February – just a long, dismal time weather wise usually. But by the time we get to March and April – hey presto – things are looking up! So, once Epiphany has passed, Lent and Easter for me are things to look forward to!

Why? Because it gives us Peace.

Last year I spoke about Geza Vermes and his book – Jesus the Jew - that Frank Bright recommended me all those years ago. I read it again as my Lenten Book and am once again turning my thoughts to what the build up to the death and the aftermath of the resurrection of Jesus would have really been like in 1st century Palestine.

Do you ever wonder what it must have been like to have been there and hear the testimonies of those first disciples about Our Lord's death and resurrection? - When they spoke about their experience of the first Easter? I wonder what feelings were stirred up in them? Supposing we had been there – supposing we had been one of those disciples. What would we have been feeling?

If we were one of his disciples, we most probably would be feeling guilty or ashamed for running away when Jesus was arrested. In the garden of Gethsemane, the initial bravado of *"Lord, here are two swords"* quickly evaporated when the temple police arrived. Fear took over: fear of the Jerusalem city authorities, fear of the armed crowd, and fear of the Roman occupation forces. The disciples fled, terrified for their own safety and freedom. They abandoned Jesus to his fate.

Except the women – they didn't flee. They followed Jesus on his painful road to Calvary.

Perhaps then it is no wonder that the women came along early one morning to tell the disciples *"The Lord is risen!"* – but the men didn't believe them. The truth is they probably didn't want to believe. Depressed by their own guilt, and still frightened of the consequences of association, they did not want to be confronted by the friend they had abandoned to a cruel death. They could reproach themselves, but they were not ready for anything like that from Jesus. They were too fragile.



However, when Jesus does appear to his disciples, he doesn't reproach them for running away. He doesn't say *"Where were you when I needed you? It's all your fault!"* Instead he says *"Peace be with you"*. If there is any reproach, it is not for the past but for the present – the fact that they cannot believe what they are seeing, what their

eyes are telling them - that Jesus is alive, risen from the dead and living!

Like the disciples we too can find it difficult to stay with Jesus and have to admit to times when we have abandoned him; faith can be a difficult and challenging thing. And yet Easter is our assurance that the Risen Lord is always with us – whether we recognise Him there or not. And whatever powerful feelings of angst rise up in us when we (yet again) discover He is with us, He just fills us - not with reproach – but with His peace.

See.... that's why I look forward to Lent and Easter. It gives us a time to reflect on the ways in which we abandon Jesus, whilst recognising that when we do encounter Him, he gives us His Peace!

So perhaps as you journey through Lent onto Easter, take time out to re-discover the Risen Lord. It's never too late and believe me, there is no reproach from Him.....only his peace.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH WORKER ROLE IN THE BENEFICE OF HARTON

ARTON My name is Rachael Harrison. I am the Children and Youth Worker for The Benefice of





Harton. As some of you will be aware, I have been in post as a Children and Youth worker for the Benefice since June 2019. I can't believe how quickly the time has flown. I have been kept busy developing Messy church along with the extremely enthusiastic and hardworking Messy church team and on the day, helpers!

With a lot of assistance from a dedicated team of volunteers we have also set up a pre-school 'Play and Pray' group at St Mary's Church Sand Hutton. I have recently set up a Benefice Families and carers Facebook page, again with some technical help! (Thanks Ruth!) This is also going well.

If you are a family within the Benefice, have carer responsibilities for children and live within the Benefice (e.g. Grandparents, Guardians /close relatives) or have children at Sand Hutton or Foston schools and would like to join the Facebook page the link is....

I am keen to network with as many people as possible who have key roles within the Benefice to find out more about their villages in terms of numbers of children, age groups etc. so I can target publicity for events and make sure all children and families are included, and that we are catering for everyone. Although I have already made contact with the schools based within the Benefice and some of the Churchwardens, I am aware I still need to meet more people and collect ideas. **Please don't hesitate to get in touch if you have any ideas you would like to contribute!**

We are also hoping to start a youth group in the late Spring which will be aimed at secondary school aged children, hopefully with some older children (e.g. 16 to 18 year olds) acting as supporters/volunteers.

I am very enthusiastic about this but am aware I will again need to rely upon an army of volunteers!

If you have a few hours to spare and are interested in volunteering for any of the activities we are running please get in touch with me. You will find it a very rewarding experience and you will be well supported. We will provide DBS checks where appropriate. I have really enjoyed taking on this role and developing what we can provide for our young people within the Benefice. I would like to extend a huge 'Thank you' to all the volunteers and supporters who have helped me get established. Everyone has been so positive about developing activities for Children and Young people.

News, views and information from around the parishes.....

BOSSALL

It has been another busy few months at St Botolph's. Particular highlights include the well-attended and beautifully orchestrated Remembrance Day service on Sunday 10th November. We were fortunate to be accompanied by five past and current serving members of the armed forces together with a bugler from the Yorkshire Regiment.



It was a fitting, but poignant reminder of the debt we owe to those who have lost their lives in armed conflict over the years, and for many a very important time in the church calendar to mark our respects.

St Botolph's also hosted a busy Christmas period as always with the crib service at 5.00 pm, followed by Midnight Mass at 11.00 pm. I am not sure what the record is, but we must have been close, with over 60 attending the Crib Service and some 120 attending the Midnight Mass.

Those who have visited the church over the last few weeks will have seen that all the paths have been re-laid with new gravel and look extremely smart! Likewise we have just completed a total overhaul of the five large lime trees which line the churchyard. All dead or overhanging branches have been removed, cut back and made safe, in line with our annual review. They too look smart and tidy, and hopefully will see us through for the next few years. The work was completed by David Bayes at Bayes Tree Services. He comes highly recommended.

CRAMBE

Autumn turned out to be mild, dark and very wet, but the equinox is past and already the days are getting longer and brighter.

There have been three services in St Michael's Church in the last quarter. Principally the Celebration of Christmas by Candlelight on December 21st. The church was a mass of candlelight both outside and in. The church was packed to the doors with over 110 people attending. The congregation was supported by 'The 200 Singers', a superb small choir from York University who also sang some beautiful choral pieces for us. A particular high spot during the service was Sam Cook's rendition of the poem 'The Unnoticed Guest' The opening line beginning with 'A plague on thy Christmas!' was delivered with great gusto and theatre by Sam which took everyone by surprise - anyone who might have dozed off would have awakened with a start! Heather Dale who has been a member of the PCC for more years than anyone can remember has also retired, as has Liz Kershaw. St Michael's is grateful to them all for their years of service and care of the church. This has now left St Michael's without a PCC.

As we go into the New Year it is time for the people of Crambe and those who love and use this church, to have a long hard think about its future, if indeed it has a future as a church alone. It would be a tragedy if after so many years St Michael's future is simply one of decline with the ultimate end being closure. There is no need for that to happen if the will to support it, work out its relevance in our lives, and its role in the benefice, and to actively adapt is there.

It is hoped that a new PCC can be convened and officers appointed at the APCM to be held on Thursday 30th April at 7.00 pm at a venue to be decided. All are welcome to attend this open meeting.
