#### From Rev Nigel.....

At the time of writing this, the schools have just broken up for the Summer holidays. I attended the Leavers' Assemblies at both Foston and Sand Hutton Schools. They were full of songs, shared memories, laughter and quite a lot of emotion, as the schools said 'farewell' to the Year 6 pupils. I'm sure they will now be looking forward, perhaps a little nervously, to starting their new secondary schools in September. They go with prayers of support from all the worshipping community in the Harton Benefice.

I do hope that everyone gets time to enjoy themselves over this summer holiday period and to find time to play and relax, children and adults both! I'm sure for a lot of parents, grandparents and everyone looking after children, these next few weeks mean having a little less time for themselves. So, it is important that we all take some time out from the busyness of life and have an occasional bit of 'Me' time, and recharge our spiritual batteries, as well as looking after our physical needs.

Jesus often withdrew from his disciples and followers and took time out to be quiet and pray. He also recommends taking time out from the worries and stresses of our busy lives. In Luke's Gospel at the end of Chapter 10, a passage I have just recently preached on, Jesus, who has been travelling, arrives in a small town called Bethany, and is invited to stay at the home of Lazarus, by Lazarus' sisters, Martha and Mary.

Hospitality was socially very important in the culture of that place and time. Martha was busy being the perfect hostess and preparing a meal for her guest. But, as Jesus spoke, her sister Mary sat at his feet to listen to him speak. Eventually Martha getting a bit fed up with doing everything on her own comes to Jesus and says, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her, then, to help me."

Jesus doesn't respond the way Martha was probably expecting him to; he neither sends Mary off to join Martha in preparing food, nor tells Martha to carry on without Mary. He replies, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted



by many things, but few things are needed - indeed only one. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

Jesus isn't saying to Martha that the work she is doing isn't important, but that she has got so wrapped up in providing for the physical needs of others and worrying about it, that she is neglecting to take time out to cater to her own spiritual needs, as her younger sister, Mary has done.

I think also that Martha, in being so busy, was missing out on time with her guest, properly interacting with Jesus and getting to know him.



I'm sure many of us have hosted parties or barbecues where we have spent so much time on preparation and ensuring everyone is fed and watered, that at the end of it we've barely had a chance to talk with any of the guests.

So this Summer, make sure you do take

some time to look after your own spiritual needs, even if it's just a quiet walk communing with nature, or snuggling in a comfy space with a good book.

(I can highly recommend the Bible, a book that often surprises and sometimes challenges), and when you are socializing make the time to enjoy the company of friends and family, and give them a chance to enjoy your company too!

Earlier this year we gave thanks to Rachael Harrison who stepped down from her role as Youth and Families Worker in the Benefice. I am now very pleased that Rachael Tearney will be taking on the role, starting at the beginning of September. Rachael brings her super talents in drama and music to the role, and I look forward very much to working with her as we go forward.

We are also grateful to Rachael Harrison who has been standing in as the Safeguarding Officer for the Benefice. This role is now being taken on by Anna Sawkins, and I am grateful to her for putting herself forward.

There is quite a bit going on across the Benefice, and we are in the early stages of creating a Pastoral Care Team. These will be members of the Church communities who will be in contact with people who may have pastoral needs, for example, being housebound. The team is being led by Adrian Watson.

Also, we have been inviting interest in creating a Benefice Healing Team. This is Christian Healing, which involves the laying on of hands and gentle prayer to help people to experience wholeness in times of difficulty and/or illness. There will be specific services of Healing and Quietness. Ian Lyall, our Licensed Lay Minister, will take the lead on this team.



I plan to distribute leaflets in August.




Our villages and schools generously contributed many items last year - thank you so much. In 2024 Amen charity were able to send out 2962 shoeboxes and would love to get over 3000 this year! Thanks to your efforts, and those of the AMEN team, the boxes reached Romania in time for Christmas and were a real blessing to those who received them.

Once again, this year, along with the shoeboxes, we plan to send blankets and good quality baby clothes (please mark bags and boxes of these very clearly). Please note hand knitted baby clothes are not required. There is also a need for pushchairs and Moses baskets. The service of blessing will be **Sunday 2**<sup>nd</sup> **November.** 

Transport costs continue to rise. We appreciate this is a tough time for lots of people in the UK but hope many will put the full £3 on a box rather than the minimum £2. We are always happy to receive donations towards transport, from individuals or churches, which is worth mentioning when you promote the shoebox collection.

Last year we suggested that any box of a similar size to a shoebox could be used. With the rise of online shopping many items arrive in boxes of all sizes and recycling is always good! To ensure fairness when distributing boxes, we

editing the magazine for a number of years. The Churchmouse signed herself off as the 'temporary editor', that was 15 years ago! The magazine has come a long way since then, expanding from 28 pages to around 40 pages, and progressed from all black and white to the vibrant colour cover generously sponsored by all the churches in the benefice, in turn. In the early days of the Churchmouse's tenure of office as editor, printing of the magazine was undertaken in the vestry of St Mary's Church Sand Hutton. Mostly, the print run is now not something to be dreaded and endured, but an enjoyable and fairly speedy process. Thanks, must also go to Rachel, Peter, Ellen and Michael for the time they spend sending out the postal copies, and filling boxes and bags with the printed copies for distribution. A huge thank you must go to the team of gallant volunteers (you know who you are!) who distribute the copies in all weathers, through every letterbox in the benefice, some 1200 of them!

We are immensely grateful to our advertisers for their support. They enable us to distribute the magazine free of charge.

Hello Everyone,

Here we are in the middle of July! Where does the time go I ask myself? I hope you have all enjoyed the sunny weather we have been experiencing over the last few months or so, but we really need the rain. The water situation is getting quite desperate. My thoughts go out to

all our local farmers who are so dependent on the weather which affects arable and animal farms alike.

The last couple of months for me have been somewhat different. After a fire at the back of the cottages where I live in Bossall, we needed to have an electrical inspection done to ensure our safety. As a result of that, it was found necessary to rewire the cottage and while all that was done there were a number of other things which need putting right.

Once I had got my head around it all, I had a good clear out and thinning down of possessions before the work could begin. After several trips to the tip and a distribution to various charity shops I returned home, sat in my chair, sighed with relief and suddenly found I could breathe more easily. We all have so much, more than enough, and often it doesn't make us any happier! I was suddenly reminded of some familiar words:

"We brought nothing into this world and it is certain we can take nothing out"

As I sat and watched the whole of my life hanging out on view to the world, I realised I had to learn from, it. A lesson in humility and patience, and I was reminded of words from St Peter: "when you were young, you used to get ready and go anywhere you wanted to; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands and someone else will bind you and take you where you do not want to go."

Old age is difficult for us all, but peoples love, generosity and patience know no bounds. I have learnt that we only have to ask for help when we are struggling and the good Lord supplies all the love and care we need. So, learn to lean more and more on our Heavenly Father and give thanks for all that he provides; help comes from the most unexpected sources, I have been amazed!

#### Church rambles with Adrian

I am continuing my church travels around churches in my church life. I visit St Mary's Goathland occasionally to take communion, a lovely welcome always. We both love this church and when in Goathland often come in to light candles and have quiet time.





I recently took communion for the first time with my Methodist friends at Hovingham where I lived for many years, a very different style to what I have been used to, but it got me thinking!

I also still occasionally attend St Margaret's Huttons Ambo, but of course Harton Benefice is my church family and home, and I/we love being part of the Benefice.

#### Cambodia... an update from Lynne Barnett



Readers may recall that my 20 years of connection and volunteering in post-Genocide Cambodia, led to a much-needed counselling training programme being developed and piloted in 2017-2020. Sadly, due to the covid pandemic and financial difficulties, it was discontinued after two cohorts of students completed the 2-year part-time course.

After the programme was complete, I returned to the UK and decided to undertake a research project to explore the effectiveness and impact of the training, and the possible need to decolonize the curriculum which had been delivered. I returned to Cambodia 2023-2024, to collect the research data and facilitate the former students undertaking participatory action research. After all, I am not Cambodian and therefore the former students' perception was most important.

My return to Cambodia was fruitful, but not exactly as I had planned it in my mind. It was a visit full of meetings, collecting research data and *ad hoc* teaching. At the time I wondered if it was as fruitful as I had hoped, but on reflection it has proved very worthwhile. It was more of a strategic planning visit than expected, exploring with Cambodian colleagues what the way forward may look like in mental health service provision.

The research data is now proving very helpful and subsequently there is a possibility that the counselling training program may restart in 2026. Having more trained Cambodian counsellors would be invaluable in helping heal the massive societal trauma that exists in the nation today.

Former students are already making a difference and, as the saying goes, 'paying forward' their personal gain by sharing their knowledge and encouraging people to support their families, neighbours and work peers.

They are encouraging communities to enhance dialogue, are generally being kind role models who openly and sensitively bring mental health topics into the public arena.

Later this year I will return to Phnom Penh for a short visit, to explore at length how the training programme may be restarted in 2026, made sustainable and ultimately Cambodian led.




