Harton Benefice PCC.....

The Benefice PCC last met on 19th September. The main point of discussion was the development of the document the "Benefice Profile". This is the full description of the Harton Benefice and its constituent churches that will be used as a major part of the formal process to recruit a new vicar. A timetable was discussed so that the post can be advertised as soon as possible.

Each PCC is asked to nominate two people in advance of the interviews, one to be on the interviewing panel and the other to act as a reserve.

Another topic discussed was Safeguarding, in that all necessary DBS screening of parishioners (PCC members, etc) has been completed. This must now be completed every 3 years (rather then every 5 years as previously required).

The next Benefice PCC meeting will be on Tuesday 21st November at 2.00 pm. Please send agenda items to the honorary secretary, Ellen Stott.

BUTTERCRAMBE

All is quiet in Buttercrambe but I thought the following bit of Buttercrambe Church history might be of interest.

In the churchyard at Buttercrambe there is a small, plain, single cross positioned in the north east corner, on its own, away from the main burial area which has always remained a mystery that is until recently when George and Sara Winn-Darley were contacted by Simon Roots who was tracing his family tree.

His great grandparents worked at Aldby Park in the late 1880s, his grandfather Henry was a coachman, and his grandmother Margaret was a cook. They had three children. Tragedy hit the family when in 1891 the youngest two Harry, aged 3 and Edith then 18 months died when the pony and trap driven by their mother fell into the lock at Buttercrambe Weir whilst visiting Mrs Ireland who was the lock keeper's wife. Whilst negotiating the trap through to the Lock House the pony had backed towards the lock, subsequently running off the lock edge and into the water. Edith and Harry were strapped into the trap and tragically drowned and they are buried in St John's Church by the plain single cross. A sad story.

CRAMBE

In our own quiet way, we have had a busy time here in Crambe with the centre of attention being our lovely St Michael's church. The churchyard rewilding project continues, and there has been a noticeable increase in the diversity of both plant and insect life. Sam's mown paths which weave their way round and across the churchyard have created beautiful tranquil short walks where one can enjoy the peace and beauty of not just the wildflowers, but the fine views of the surrounding hills.

At the beginning of August, a team from the Lower Derwent Valley Nature Reserve and Natural England came with their strimmers to cut all the long grass, an annual task. They did a marvellous job and largely raked it into piles for us, a huge thank you to them.

The following week the villagers and some of the Aubergines came to do the final rake up and loading of all the cut grass into a huge trailer kindly brought by a local farmer. It was hard work, but much fun was had by all. We rounded the job off with hotdogs and cakes!

The highlight of the day was hauling a ladder up the outside



of the tower so we could drop it through the roof hatch into the chamber below. Our QI had stated we needed to dispose of our existing wooden ladder and replace it with a metal one, and everyone knows you can't get a rigid 14ft metal ladder up a tight spiral staircase! Mission accomplished!

More recently, Paula, Clare, Millie and Simon from the village, between them planted over 900 bulbs in the churchyard. The bulbs were generously donated by everyone in the village, a sterling effort for which we are very grateful. We look forward to seeing a riot of colour in the spring.

The following day St Michael's had its Harvest Festival service which was taken by Rachel Benson. It was good to welcome Canon Maggie Mclean from York Minister who came and preached. Our thanks go to them and to Michael Harran for playing the organ for us. Our grateful thanks to Linda Walker who did all the floral arrangements, and to those who supplied fresh produce and tinned goods. These were given to the Free Fridge in Norton and the Malton Food Bank.

Lily Festival: On November 2nd at 7.00 pm.This is a Benefice service and we look forward to welcoming as many of you as are able, or would like to attend. It is a service of remembrance for all those we have loved and lost. Even if you cannot attend, your loved ones can be remembered. The church is always open, and for the following two weeks the lilies will be at their best for those who would like to just come at any time and spend a few quiet moments in the church and maybe light a candle.

On Saturday December 16th at 6.00 pm our annual Celebration of Christmas in carols, poetry and prose by candlelight will take place. The 200 Singers from York will be joining us again this year, and everyone is welcome to come along and share this event with us, and afterwards at Crambe House for mulled wine and mince pies.

FLAXTON

Jumble sale: Thank you so much to everyone who donated goods and gave their time in support of the Jumble Sale fundraising event. It was a great success due to you in the community.

Harvest: The Harvest celebration service was well supported. Many thanks to the Benefice Choir who joined us on this occasion helping to raise the roof with their singing. The bring and share lunch in the village hall was well supported and it was good to have friends join us who were unable to make it to the service. A huge thank you for all the gifts given which were passed on to the Salvation Army who were grateful to receive them. A letter of thanks has been received from the Salvation Army and is on display on the lychgate notice board and inside the church.

Sheriff Hutton Sunday Market: Last December Flaxton Church joined with Sheriff Hutton Church and Marston Church in a fundraising event. Over £600 was raised and shared between the three churches. We have been invited to join the two churches again. This will take place on Sunday November 19th 10.00 am to 1.30 pm at Sheriff Hutton village hall. We would be very grateful for donations of cakes and help on the day. There is no denying it is hard work but fun and you get to meet new people.

Advent 3rd December – 24th December. As in previous years there will be no flowers in church. Decoration of the church for Christmas day will be on Friday 22nd December between 10.00 am and 12 noon. If Friday is not

convenient the church will be open on Thursday between 10.00 am and 3.00 pm. Vases will be at the back of the church.

Holy Communion/Toy Service: 10^{th} December at 10.00 am. Once again, this service is in support of the Salvation Army Christmas Appeal. This is a joint effort between the Salvation Army and Social Services. They are requesting **new** gifts for children between the ages of 0 - 18 and their parents/carers. 

Christmas star biscuits


Ingredients

250g self-raising flour½ tsp cinnamon125g caster sugar

125g cold butter cut into cubes½ tsp ground ginger1 egg beaten

Method

Grease baking trays. Preheat oven to 200C/180°C Rub butter into flour in a large mixing bowl until it resembles breadcrumbs.



Rollout dough on a floured board to approx. 5mm/¼ inch thick.

Using a star cutter, cut out stars. Continue to roll remnants until all used up. Place on baking trays. Put in the oven for 10-15 minutes until the stars are pale gold on top. Cool on a wire rack. Store in an airtight tin.


